The family-owned enterprise HÖRTIG Rohrpost GmbH (internationally also known as Hortig Air Tube Transport Systems), founded in 1967, is one of the leading manufacturers of pneumatic tube systems world-wide. From the headquarters in Bayreuth/Germany the pneumatic conveyers are developed, produced and installed at the customers' facilities.

HÖRTIG Rohrpost GmbH offers integrated intralogistics solutions complete from one source. The company plans, produces and installs ultra-modern pneumatic tube systems and offers an extensive after sales service including remote and on-site maintenance.

The pneumatic tube systems assist companies with achieving efficient in-house logistics. They convey, for instance, lab samples, tools, cash, documents or bulk cargo. Through the pneumatic conveyance method, the in-house transport process is optimized regarding time, duration and cost of transportation. Furthermore, safety is ensured by the ease of use and by special protective mechanisms for the range of transported goods. That means that today our systems are frequently installed in hospitals, supermarkets, banks and industrial enterprises.

Over 600 systems from HÖRTIG are installed in about 45 countries. So far the focus thereby was mainly on the European area and Asia because of the headquarters in Bayreuth/Germany and the sales office in Singapore. Numerous additional partner arrangements ensure that customers all over the world can reap the benefits from using our pneumatic tube systems.

The long history and sustained growth of HÖRTIG Rohrpost GmbH are based on the quality offered as well as on the strong focus on research and development activities in our four internal R&D departments. The company won the gold medal of the Bavarian state price for exceptionally innovative products twice already and it has been ranked among the "TOP 100" innovative SMEs in Germany.
